Dear Parents and Carers,

This week Monday's assembly was based on 'wisdom,' which is one of our Christian values. We examined how gaining knowledge and experiences within life allow us to make sensible decisions for ourselves and others. This was then followed by our OPAL assembly. Here, we looked at a charter designed to ensure positive play experiences for the children. I am very proud of how the children are shaping their thinking around play experiences for themselves and others and engaging with their peers in all areas of school life.

Building on these key experiences, it has been wonderful to see Years 3 and 4 enjoy their Victorian day, giving them a clearer picture of school life from that era.

We met with children and parents on Thursday to discuss the logistics for the Spain trip. It is most certainly coming together, and we are set to have an enriching experience.

OPAL - We ask that you send in with your child a pair of wellington boots or waterproof trainers that they can keep in school. As the weather is beginning to close in, we really want to enable the children to play on the field over the winter. Having the boots or trainers means that they can do so without getting their feet wet. If you have any old boots, please could you donate them to the school for others to wear. We are planning to invest in outdoor boot racks so children are able to store their boots and access all areas of play even when it's wet.

We are going to send out information about homework to support you and your child. We will follow up with meetings for each year group to give you the opportunity to understand our approaches to homework while having the opportunity to get a tea/coffee and speak to other parents, your class teacher, myself, and the pastoral team. I will send out further information shortly.

Finally, our school attendance is currently just above 96%, which is good. However, please speak to a member of the office team if you have concerns about your child's attendance. We will be meeting weekly to review this and will support you and your children where needed.


We will be collecting for all of next week only.


FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND PUPIL PREMIUM


