


2. What do you know about the Olympics so far? Create a fact file, information poster or leaflet to explain everything you know about the Olympics.

4. Find the 'Year 5 and 6 Statutory Word List' document on the Home Learning area. These are words which children are expected to know how to spell by the end of Year 6.

Next to each word are the letters R and W. For each word you can read, tick the R box. Then, test yourself. If you can spell (write) the word correctly, tick the W box. Remember not to look while you are trying to spell the words - that won't help you!

If there are words you don't yet know, leave the boxes blank. We'll work on those words over the next few weeks! Hopefully we'll soon be able to tick a few more off!

5. Find the 'Tanni Grey-Thompson' document on the Home Learning area. Read the information and answer the questions in your book.





I have also included the answers here so you can check how you've got on. Remember, it will help your learning best if you have a go by yourself first, then check to see if you are correct!

6. Read your book every day! Don't forget, there are over 40,000 books to choose from on Epic!






<p>2. Visit https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-6/</p>  <p>Go to Week 6. This will take you to a series of lessons to further develop your understanding of percentages. Alternatively, you can find the 'White Rose Video Links' on the Home Learning area. The accompanying activity sheets are available on the Home Learning area. The answer sheets are also here so you can check how you've got on. It's always a really good idea to mark your work and try to understand what went wrong if you have made a mistake.</p> <p>Complete as many of the sessions as you can this week. For the remainder of this half term, we will largely be following the White Rose programme to support our Home Learning in maths.</p>
