

## Year Two Home Learning

### Maths W/C 8.6.20

**Please note that your child may have limited knowledge in the Maths focus 'Money' this week. They may have some knowledge when naming different coins and making simple amounts using tens and ones. Your child will need support and encouragement to help them learn something new.**

This week's Maths focus is all about Money. In Year Two it is important that children are provided with practical situations to use coins to make amounts of money. If you have any spare change then please allow your child to use the coins with their learning this week.

Your child will revise and be confident at recognising the British coins and notes and knowing their value.

Your child will develop their understanding to count coins and add them up accurately.

Your child will begin to learn how to make the same amount of money in different ways using a variety of coins.

Your child will begin to recognise the £ and p symbols when reading amounts of money.

### Money Activities for the week: (I would suggest choosing one activity a day – Enjoy!)

- Share with your child all the British coins, you can use real coins or the coin resource attached. Discuss the value of each and talk about how many 1ps make each coin. Encourage your child to remember that £1 is worth 100p. Ask your child to order the coins from the lowest value to the highest.  
**Please note:** It is common for children to have the misconception that the bigger the coin in size, the larger its value. Please correct your child if this happens.
- Share with your child some money amounts up to £1 e.g. 56p, 83p, 37p. Write these on small squares of paper or card for your child to choose. Encourage your child to pick an amount. Look at the tens and ones. Use 10ps and 1ps to make the amount.  
**Note:** If you do not have enough real change to do this, then you can use printed money from the resource or you could work with your child to make some pretend coins out of paper, card, or even label some plastic counters or buttons.
- Use the resource 'How much money is in my jar?' to count the coins accurately and write the correct amount.  
**Note:** If this cannot be printed then please use it as a guide to make some of your own. You could even use an empty jar and add some coins and challenge your child to count them. Check it with your child and repeat.

- Provide your child with some money labels up to £1. You can begin to extend this to £5 if you feel your child is confident and encourage them to read the £ and p symbols. Ask them to choose a label and make the amount using coins in two different ways. Ask your child to record their coins in an addition number sentence, for example:

$$20 + 10p + 2p = 32p \text{ and } 10p + 10p + 10p + 2p = 32p$$
