

Year One Home Learning

Maths W/C 8.6.20

Please note that this is a new area of Maths for your child in Year One since covering a small amount of money in Reception. They may have some knowledge when naming different coins. Your child will need support and encouragement to help them learn something new.

This week's Maths focus is all about Money. In Year One it is important that children are provided with practical situations to use coins to make simple amounts of money. If you have any spare change (10ps and 1ps are most useful at this stage) then please allow your child to use the coins with their learning this week.

Your child will begin to learn the value of each of the British coins.

Your child will begin to learn the value of some of the British notes (£10 and £5)

Your child will begin to use their knowledge of number and place value to make simple money amounts up to £1 using tens and ones (10ps and 1ps)

Money Activities for the week: (I would suggest choosing one activity a day – Enjoy!)

- Share with your child all the British coins, you can use real coins or the coin resource attached. Discuss the value of each and talk about how many 1ps make each coin. You can begin to introduce that £1 is 100p.
- Share with your child some simple money amounts up to 50p e.g. 24p, 45p, 13p. Write these on small squares of paper or card for your child to choose. Encourage your child to pick an amount. Look at the tens and ones. Use 10ps and 1ps to make the amount.
Note: If you do not have enough real change to do this, then you can use printed money from the resource or you could work with your child to make some pretend coins out of paper, card, or even label some plastic counters or buttons.
- Make a mini shop and label some items with amounts up to 50p. Role play buying some items from the shop and using the correct money (10ps and 1ps) to buy the items.
- Provide your child with some money labels up to 50p. You can begin to extend this to £1 if you feel your child is confident. Ask them to choose a label and make the amount using tens and ones. Ask your child to record their coins in an addition number sentence, for example:

$$10p + 10p + 10p + 1p + 1p = 32p$$

- Play Doorway online 'Cashing in' and choose amounts up to £1 to practice using the correct amount of coins to make a money amount.
