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Outcomes to date:

Monitoring shows that:

- Staff subject knowledge and delivery skills for teaching PE has been increased as a result of two years' high quality coaching input
- Pupil progress and standards have been increased in core skills for PE and general fitness of pupils is on an upward trend (see also impact of 'A Mile a Day')
- Pupil participation in extra-curricular sports has increased and a wide variety of provision has been put in place (football, netball, kwik cricket, multi-skills, table tennis, tennis)
- *We need to continue to implement a scheme of work for PE across TVF, including the use of teaching sequences with elicitation and exit tasks appropriate to ARE*
- *NQTs need CPD for subject knowledge and PPA in PE / LiL*
